

## MAKE A FLOSS-COVERED WASHER NECKLACE WITH



### Materials Needed:

Washers (We used a total of 10 in various sizes)

[Janlynn's Cool Cord](#)

Glue (We used Glue Tape as well as hot glue)

## LAY OUT YOUR DESIGN





Determine how many washers you need and how many to wrap in each color floss.

## TO WRAP WASHERS WITH FLOSS




1. Cut a length of floss. The exact length will vary depending upon the size of the washer you are working with. Secure the washer and one end of the floss with your thumb.
2. Wrap floss around the washer, moving it in and out through the center hole. Secure your loose end of floss as shown.



3. Continue wrapping, tightening the floss as you go.
4. When your washer is completely covered with floss, secure your loose end with a dab of glue.

## COMPLETE YOUR NECKLACE

Once you have wrapped all your washers with floss, you'll need to connect them together. Thread floss through the front of two washers at a time, tying your knots at the back to ensure they will not be visible when your necklace is worn. Each red line below represents points at which the washers were connected.



## EMBELLISH YOUR NECKLACE




If you wish to add further embellishments as we did, wind contrasting colored floss around select washers, with knots tied at the back. Now your "charm" is done but you need to make your "chain."



A simple, Chinese Staircase pattern was used to create two lengths of “chain,” represented by the red lines, above.

## **MAKE A CLOSURE**



To secure the necklace in the back, we wrapped a small washer with floss, sewed and hot glued it to one end of the Chinese Staircase. On the other side, we created a loop and sewed it on.
